

Teen Anger: How to Regulate Your Home Atmosphere!

Teen angst and anger are universal and typically scary to both parents and teens. This workshop will explore anger from the teen's perspective. Teens tell caregivers much about themselves when they unleash their inner poison. Listening to the messages beneath those emotions help parents know how to identify and adjust to their young person's emotional needs. Participants will examine the many faces of anger and factors that push anger out of control while learning ways to step out of harmful family cycles and into patterns that strengthen the teen/parent relationship.
